This beautiful Queen Anne style Victorian home was built in the early 1860s by Judge Charles Fernald as a wedding gift for his bride. "The Palms" was home to the members of the Fernald family until the late 1950s and still contains many of their personal items and furnishings.

THE TRUSSELL-WINCHESTER ADOBE



Also on the grounds, this adobe home is a mixture of architectural styles. It marks the transition from Mexican to American rule. In 1854, Captain Horatio Gates Trussell built the home for his family. It combines traditional elements of adobe construction, as well as timber and brass from a shipwreck off Anacapa Island.
